1 **CITY OF HOMER** 2 **HOMER, ALASKA** 3 Mayor 4 **RESOLUTION 14-103** 5 A RESOLUTION OF THE HOMER CITY COUNCIL IN SUPPORT OF THE 6 7 ALASKA MARITIME WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PLAN. 8 9 WHEREAS, Alaska's maritime sector employs a workforce of over 70,000 skilled 10 workers, making the maritime sector the largest private sector employer in Alaska; and 11 12 WHEREAS, The maritime sector is critical to the economy of Homer; and 13 WHEREAS, Many of the marine sector jobs in Homer require a high degree of technical 14 and professional skill and pay family-sustaining wages; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, Alaska maritime employers are contending with a 'graying' workforce, and seek to expand the number of Alaskans throughout the state who have the employability and 18 19 technical skills, expertise and motivation to be competitive in the job market; and 20 21 WHEREAS, Alaska's Governor and University of Alaska President together established an initiative that engaged with industry leaders, employers and the State of Alaska to develop 22 the Alaska Maritime Workforce Development Plan; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, An Industry Advisory Committee is now in place to work with the State and with the University of Alaska system to implement the Alaska Maritime Workforce 26 27 Development Plan; and 28 WHEREAS, The Alaska Maritime Workforce Development Plan is a call to action for 29 30 industry, educators and state government to work together to keep this economic sector 31 vibrant, to grow the number of Alaskans comprising this workforce and to ensure Alaskans are qualified to fill the skilled and well-paid Alaska maritime positons; and 32 33 WHEREAS, The Alaska Maritime Workforce Development Plan seeks to address issues 34 of workforce recruitment, retention, training in job readiness and in core competencies and 35 ongoing professional development in emerging and high demand occupational categories; 36 and 37 38 39 WHEREAS, The Alaska Maritime Workforce Development Plan will be implemented most effectively through an industry-led process that involves the joint efforts of industry, the 40 Alaska Departments of Labor and Workforce Development and Education and Early 41 Childhood Development, the University of Alaska system, regional training centers and other 42

education providers, community development quota (CDQ) organizations, tribal and local government, the K-12 educational system and other training providers; and WHEREAS, Workforce development has been identified by the City of Homer as a priority in the Comprehensive Plan and the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of Homer, Alaska, supports the Alaska Maritime Development Plan and the cooperative efforts of the Industry Advisory Committee and other stakeholders to implement the strategies contained in the plan.
