Registration



Native Youth Olympics NYO: Team Homer Halibuts

Native Youth Olympics (NYO) is a collection of games that mimic the skills needed by Alaska Native People to survive and thrive in the Alaskan terrain and climate. The games were played for fun and also to keep hunters in top form. These contests helped improve physical strength, stamina, skill, and the ability to work as a community toward a common goal. Today the games are played mainly for fun, but still carry the traditional value of striving for your best while helping and supporting your teammates and other teams.

The goal for the Homer Halibuts NYO team is to influence members to improve their own health and well-being and to teach leadership and respect values that contribute to making a stronger community.

Some of the games that will be taught include: Alaskan High Kick, Wrist Car-

ry, Arm Pull, Two-Foot High Kick, Indian Stick Pull, Seal Hop, Eskimo Stick Pull, Scissor Broad Jump, Kneel Jump, One- Hand Reach and One-Foot High Kick

This team accepts all students, grades 1-12, regardless of ethnicity. Practices will be twice a week, starting in January. Members will have opportunities to travel to multiple regional invitational events as well as the chance to compete in Junior NYO and Senior NYO State Competitions in Anchorage. Jewelry Making: Introductory Silversmithing


