



Hello Gentlemen,

I have some additional comments/questions about the materials in the packets for the February 15 PARCAC work session and regular meeting.

- 1. One of the items for discussion relates to the Karen Hornaday Park Master Plan and in particular, the future of the campground. You are asking the Commission to discuss these matters and make recommendations to the City Council. We cannot do this important work without more information. For example, while the Master Plan talks about the various options for the campground, it fails to address pros and cons of each option. It also fails to address potential capital, operational and maintenance costs of the options. Without this information, the Commission cannot mindfully weigh the strengths and weaknesses of the options or make informed decisions. Please provide this information, regarding the campground options, in a supplemental memorandum.
- 2. Generally, the Master Plan is devoid of cost information. This is a huge weakness, which need to be remedied if we have any hope of turning wishes and dreams into reality. Please provide order of magnitude cost information for the various features of the plans. This should also address operational/maintenance costs.
- 3. One of the issues raised in the KHP Master Plan relates to drainage on the north side of the ballfields/playground area. Brody Jones, Public Works, did some work back there in 2022 or 23. It would be helpful if Chad spoke with Brody before the PARCAC meeting to apprise us of whether that work was successful. Also, a note about this should be added to the Master Plan.


