A. Port and Harbor Director's Report for May 2014

Harbormaster Hawkins reviewed his staff report that was included in the meeting packet.

PORT AND HARBOR ADVISORY COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING MAY 28, 2014

Commissioner Zimmerman reported that the City Council has taken the public people off the Lease Committee and it is only department heads now. There was brief discussion about the reasoning for the change. Harbormaster Hawkins added that leases will come forward for public vetting through City Council and probably this Commission as well.

## **PUBLIC HEARING**

#### PENDING BUSINESS

- A. Harbor Rate Increase Proposals
  - Memo to Port & Harbor Advisory Commission from Port Director/Harbormaster Re:
     1999 TORA Agreement between City and State Purchasing the Harbor

The Commission reviewed the rate schedule and talked about the gradual linear method. A suggestion was made to break down the o- 4o' class of boats in an effort to give a break to the smaller boats.

They talked again of the reasoning behind the proposal and whether there is a need for the proposals. They also addressed concerns of what this money raised will be used for and where it will go.

HOWARD/HARTLEY MOVED TO ADOPT THE 10 YEAR PROGRAM FOR INCREASING COSTS.

There was discussion about the differences between the 5 and 10 year schedule for increase. Question was raised as to the accuracy of the numbers because there doesn't seem to be much of a difference between the rates themselves over the 5 year period and the 10 year period. It was explained that the percentage increase is 32% and also the consumer price index of 2.7%. At the end of the 5 year plan the computer price index would be applied for annual increase, the same at the end of the 10 year plan. It was suggested that a 5 year option may be better because the annual increases aren't that different. Another view is that the 10 year implementation would be more palatable for the users.

HOWARD/HARTLEY MOVED TO APPLY THE SQUARE FOOT METHOD IN DEVELOPING THE RATE STRUCTURE.

It was suggested that the square footage method is the more fair and equitable way to distribute costs in the harbor, than the current linear method. In previous discussion it was recognized the difference between the square foot method and the gradual linear method were almost a wash and question was raised which method is easier to administrate. Harbormaster Hawkins responded there are pros and cons to both, administratively. In talking to administration in Kodiak, they felt there were extra steps necessary to process the square foot method, and the graduated method is easier, only having to know the length of the boat.

It was acknowledged that none of the options are perfect, but the square foot method would encompass boats as they become beamier and be better on those with the old narrow boats. Looking

at length times width would be more equitable because everyone's boat would be closer to the square foot cost than the graduated linear would be.

It was noted that this process is just narrowing down preferred options that the commission can now work on fine tuning. Harbormaster Hawkins said we can do a lot of the leg work, but at some point they may want to consider bringing the consultant back to help develop and finalize it. He will check in to costs for that and they can make a decision later.

#### COMMENTS OF THE AUDIENCE

Doug Van Patten, city resident, appreciates the harbor, the improvements, and the staff and how much it's changed since the 70's, because it used to be a mess. He commented regarding rates and questioned whether the harbor gets any of the personal property tax, overslope development after the last major harbor expansion, and discounts relating to owners with more than one boat in the harbor. He agrees that the square foot method is fairer that the linear method, suggested cameras to see people who are creating wake and charging fines, and concerns about not being able to launch a boat because it isn't registered for a slip.

Harbormaster Hawkins encouraged commissioners to talk to users about all the harbor projects going on out there and to excuse us for our mess. He also let them know that they got the green light for the Deep Water Dock Feasibility project.

Commissioner Donich said it was good to hear from the users in the harbor. He thinks there is a lot to digest here, but he guesses its reality and no one wants to pay more. Hopefully we can maintain a nice harbor and he thinks they are going in the right direction.

Hi Walt,

In the newspaper last week it was mentioned that the CIP list was coming up and if the public had any input that we should do so. As a concerned citizen I'd like to make a suggestion.

As you know the City is presently spending quite a large sum of money making improvements to system 5 float at the harbor. Recently we had a chance to walk system 5 with a engineer from Transpac Marine while proposing a new utility shed float to the system as part of a change order the City was requesting. While we did not wind up supplying a new float as part of our change order the engineer did express, through his observations, that the overall system 5 floats had obviously lost much of its floatation freeboard since its initial installation.

He further explained that the remaining life span of the float system is greatly reduced by this loss because the wood whaler structure and connecting hardware is now partially submerged.

Since system 5 is such an important component of the overall harbor making sure that its life can be extended to the maximum extent possible would seem to be a major concern of the City and Harbor.

The engineer from Transpac Marine said that adding additional floatation to the float system would achieve the goal of extending its life span. Please consider doing an analysis and correction of the floatation on system 5 as part of the CIP list.
